Introduction to this course

If you take ICT as part of your A Level study programme will introduce you to the fundamentals of ICT, providing a foundation from which to extend your knowledge of this rapidly evolving area. Through practical, hands-on work and theory you will learn about the principles of problem solving using ICT, the range of applications and the effects of their use so you can apply this understanding when developing ICT solutions to problems.

Entry Requirements

You need five GCSEs at grade A* to C, including English, maths and Science. Previous study of IT is required.

Career prospects

How will I be assessed?

Assessment is via a combination of coursework assessment (40%) and a written examination (60%). There is one written exam and one item of coursework.

Mandatory Units

The course consists following two modules:

Unit G062: Structured ICT Tasks
